# OFFICE OF THE PRINCIPAL GOVT. PG COLLEGE FOR WOMEN SECTOR-14 PANCHKULA

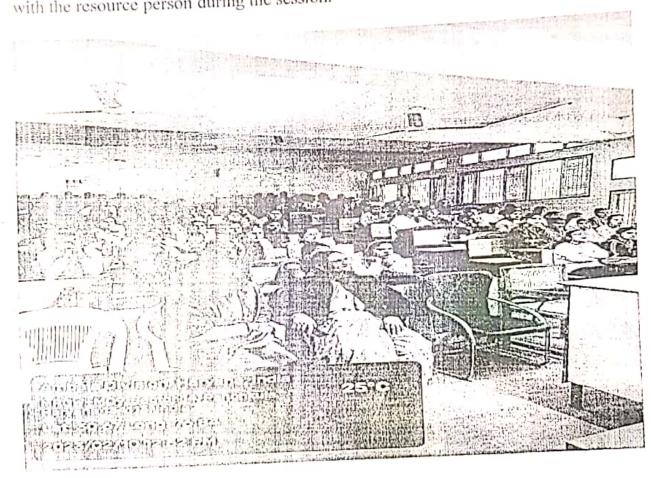

The convenor of the Women Cell Dr. AlkaSharmaand the convenor of the Placement Cell Dr. Anjali Siwach on the first day of the series discussed the aims and objectives of this initiative in the gracious presence of the worthy principal Dr. RichaSetia. The lecture series included not only physical but mental health as well. It was educative about Healthy lifestyles and problems due to unhealthy lifestyles, communicable and non-communicablediseases, and mantras to boost physical as well as mental health. This lecture series started from10th to 16<sup>th</sup> February, 2023. On a daily basis around 200 girl students participated and benefited from these informative lectures.Dr. Madhu, Dr. Isha, Dr. Anita Raj Prof. Balwinder, Dr. Sunita Rani, Dr. Kalpna were present in the program.

#### DAY 1 Report

Day 1 of the lecture series was dedicated to "Menstrual Health and Personal Hygiene", and "Cervical Cancer Awareness". Dr. Rita Kalra, SMO sector 6 hospital Panchkula was the resource person. The venue was graced by the presence of the principal Dr. Richa Setia. The resource person informed the students that a pad should be changed every 6-8 hours. She refuted the myths that sour food like pickles, curd, etc should not be eaten she said there is no need to follow a different diet while on periods and girls can gym as well. She also told that on average woman would observe menstruation every month of her life for approximately 35

years. Thus, over this period the average woman would go through more or less 20000 sanitary pads. Most of the pads are non-biodegradable and impact our environment. Therefore, she emphasized the use of biodegradable pads, tempons, and menstrual cups. Also, the second part of the discussion talked about cervical cancer, its causes, cups. More than 150 students actively participated and interacted with the resource person during the session.

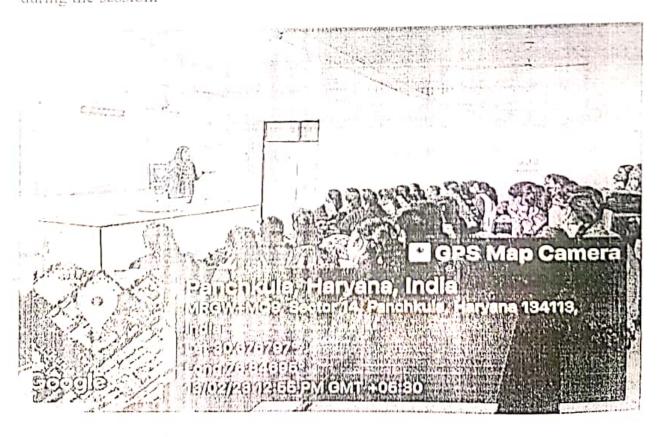


Day 2 Report

Third day of the lecture series the topic was "What is Dental Health" and "Disease of Oral Cavity". Dr.PrarthanaNegiKalra (MDS Oral and maxillofacial surgeonConsultantoral surgeon at Dr. Sanjay KalraMultispeciality Dental Clinic Panchkula) was the resource person. She informed the students that there are billions of bacteria living inside our mouths at any given time. Many of these bacteria build up as plaque, causing tooth decay (cavities) and gingivitis, which can lead to periodontal (gum) disease. For a healthy smile, you must practice good oral hygiene every day. Brushing after meals, using antimicrobial mouthwash, and flossing at least once daily help keep these disease-causing bacteria from reproducing in your mouth, causing tooth decay. And, healthy diets that minimize sugary and starchy foods also help to keep those bad bacteria under control.More than 150 students actively participated and interacted with the resource person during the session.

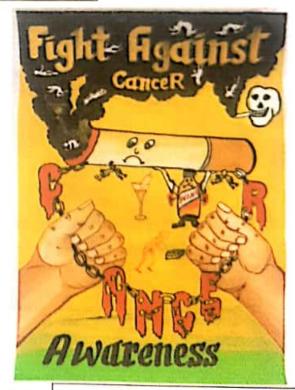

Name of the Activity- Extension lecture on Stress and Time Management

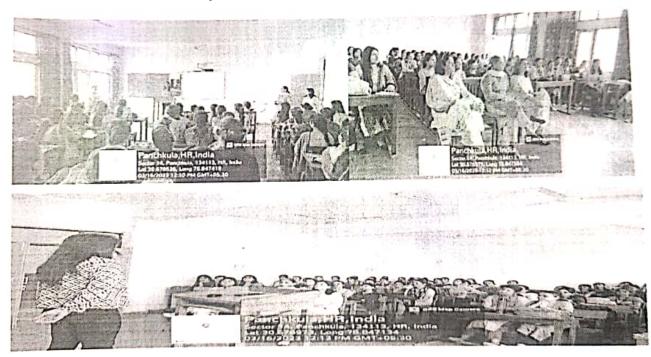
