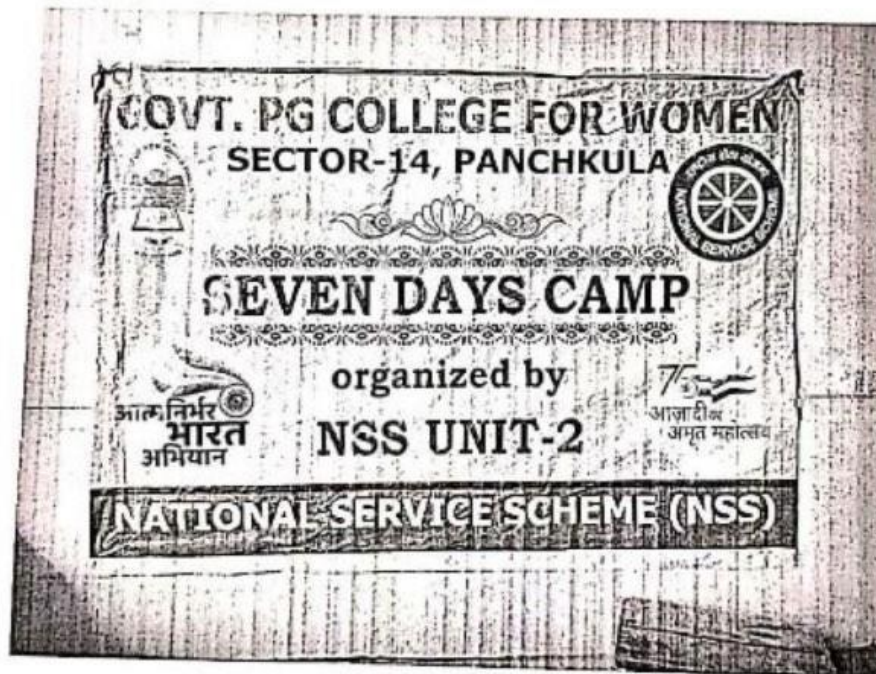
The Lecture was ended by Dr. (Mrs.) Alka Sharma the Convener, WSDC with the vote of thanks of resource person.

Report on 7 Day-night N.S.S. Camp (20th Feb – 26th Feb 2024)

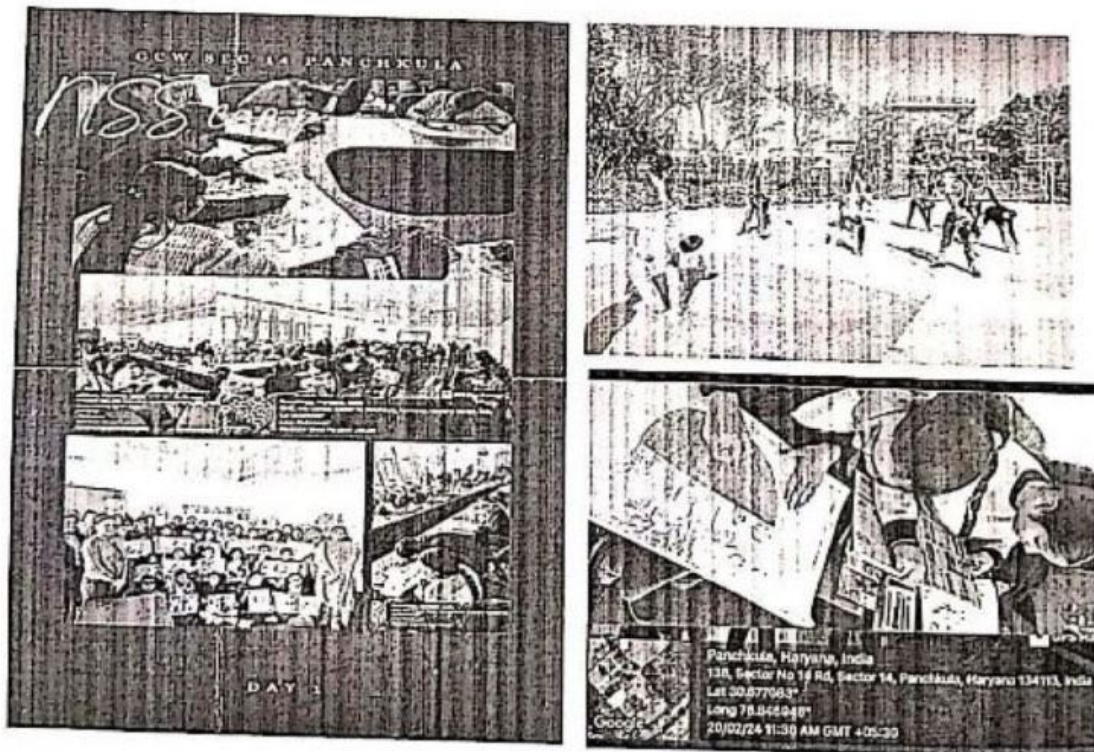

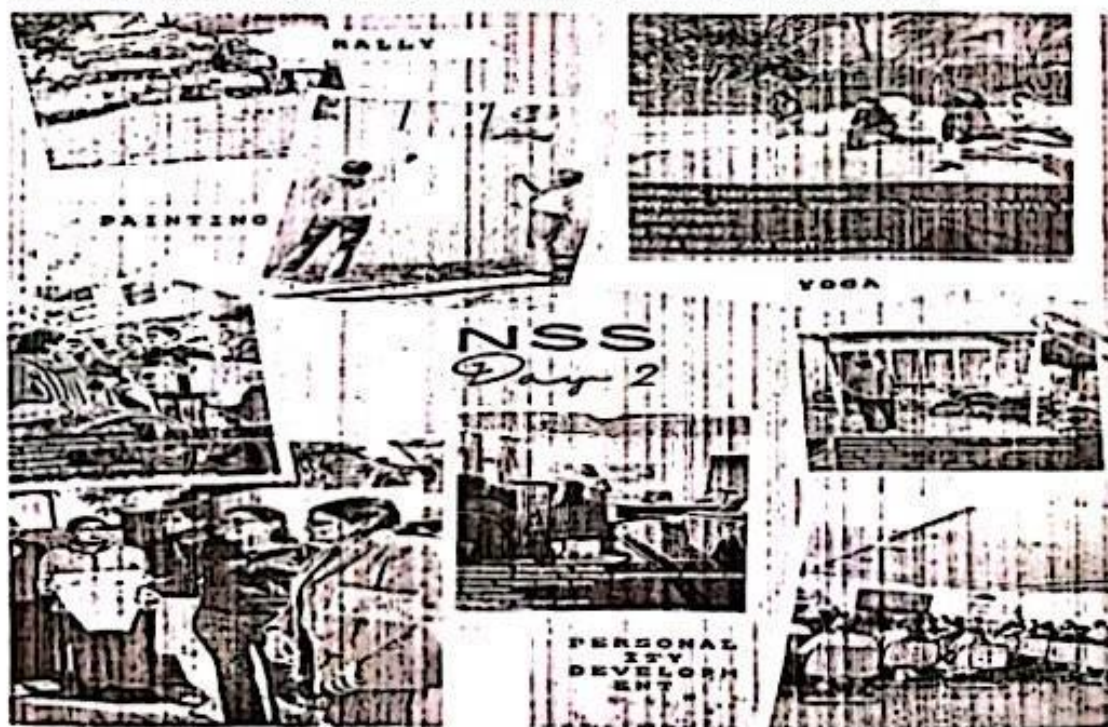
Day 1 (20.02.2024)

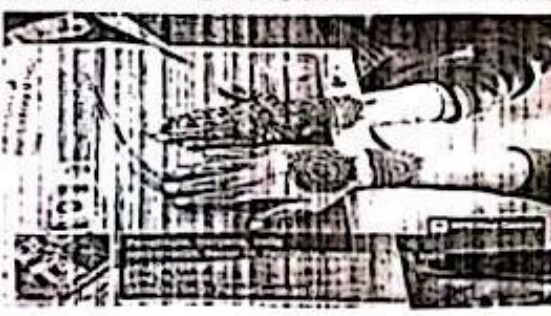
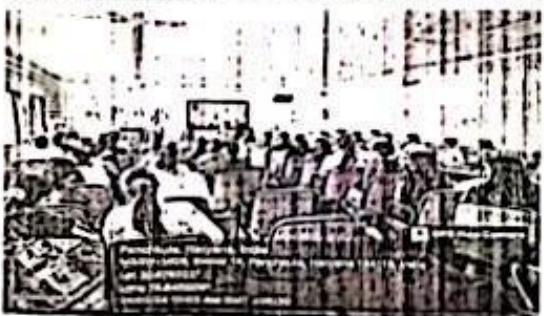
Day 4 (23.02.2024)

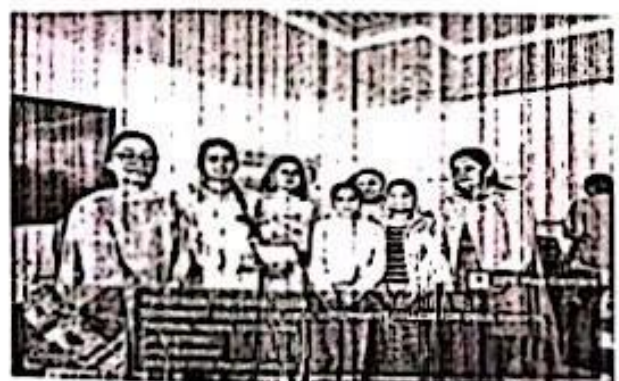
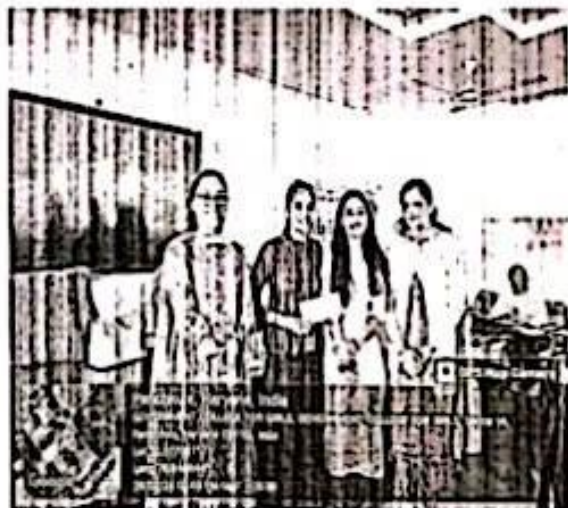
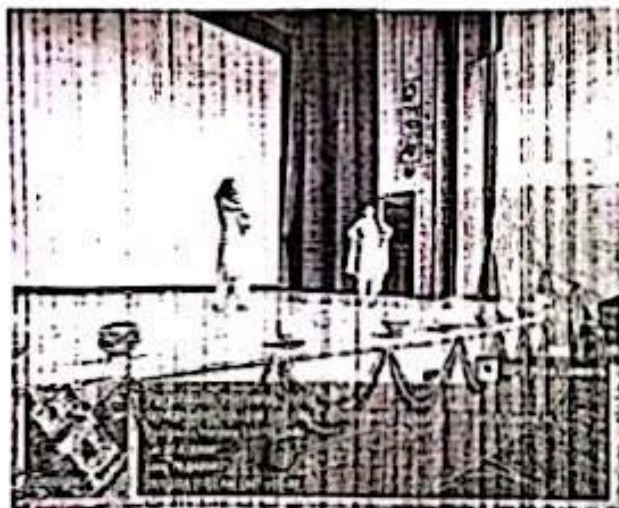
Day 6 (25.02.2024)

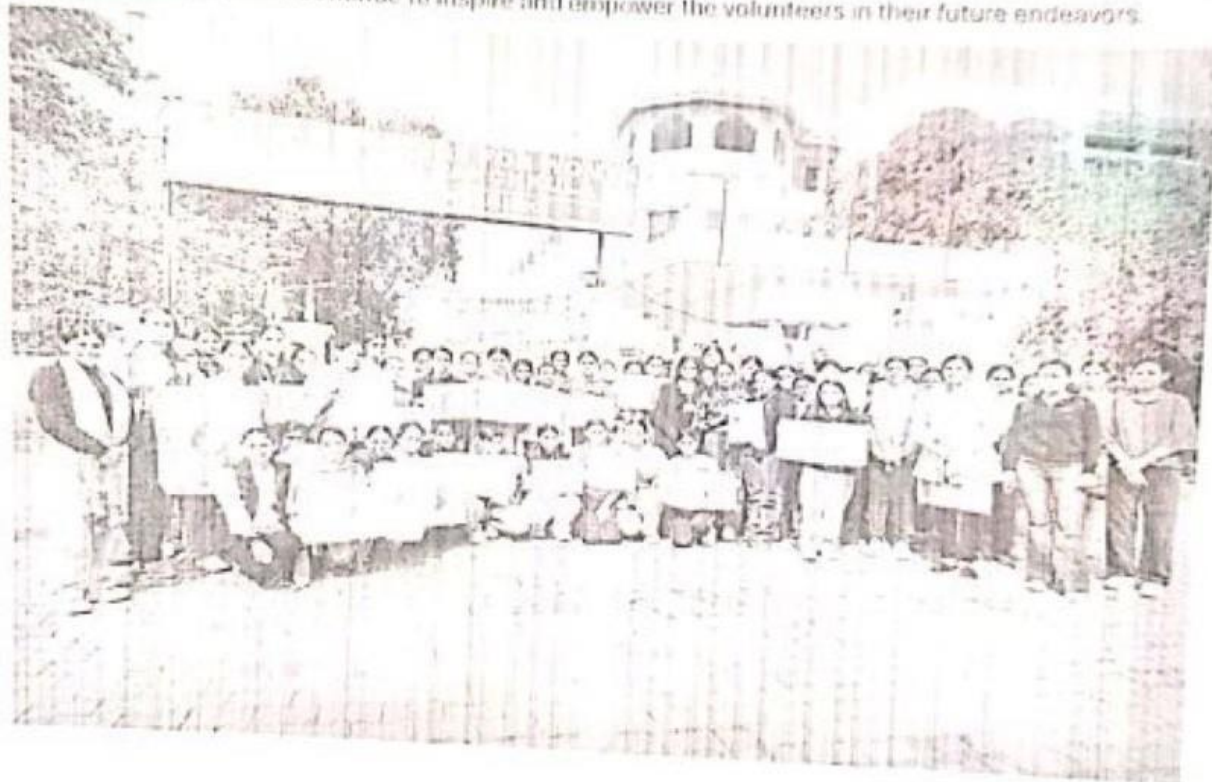


Day 7 (26.02.2024)
