Editorial

In Utopia for Realists, Dutch thinker Rutger Bregman highlights a paradox described by psychologist Jean Twenge: today's children, constantly praised as "special," often grow fragile rather than resilient. Twenge warns, "This constant affirmation... does not build resilience but cultivates fragility. Polished on the outside, hollow within." Instead of finding strength, many young people are overwhelmed by a world that offers endless possibility-but also loneliness and fierce competition. So what happens when these kids step into adulthood? Instead of the promised wonderland, they face a tough world of nonstop competition and uncertainty. Mental health struggles among youth are soaring as social media pressures, toxic masculinity, and rising violence reshape their lives. The Emmy-winning Netflix series Adolescence vividly portrays these challenges, following a teenager caught in a spiral fueled by the complexities of modern life. Unlike earlier generations, who found guidance in family, religion, and political ideals, Gen Z's moral compass is shaped by digital fandoms, online cults, and influencer culture. Groups like K-pop's BTS ARMY or political online communities serve as new "cathedrals" of belonging. Yet, this fractured identity often leaves youth searching for genuine connection amid commodified relationships and intense peer pressure, complicating young people's search for self. Bregman poignantly summarizes the dilemma: "The best minds of my generation are thinking about how to make people click ads." As youth navigate this digital wilderness, their fragile hearts beat beneath promises that too often feel unfulfilled. Their stories urge us to support resilience, connection, and meaning beyond surface-level affirmation in a world shaped by digital tides. Literature serves as a powerful medium for exploring mental illness, using various narrative techniques to reflect and influence societal attitudes. Historically, mental health representations have transitioned from stigmatizing portrayals to empathetic and complex characterizations. Literature has always done more than entertain—it gives language to experiences that are often invisible, including the complexity of mental health. When characters struggle with anxiety, depression, or trauma on the page, readers are invited into an intimate understanding that goes beyond clinical definitions. Through metaphor, voice, and storytelling, literature can articulate feelings of isolation, confusion, or despair in ways medical discourse cannot, offering empathy and recognition to those who might otherwise feel unseen. Classic works like Charlotte Perkins Gilman's The Yellow Wallpaper show how women's mental health was once dismissed and controlled under patriarchal medical practices, transforming a tale of confinement into a powerful critique of treatment itself. Sylvia Plath's The Bell Jar gives readers a haunting firstperson perspective on depression, shaping public conversations about the lived experience of psychological illness. More recently, Sally Rooney's Normal People uses therapy scenes to reveal the vulnerability beneath social roles, showing how care, however imperfect, can become a space for connection and growth. Even controversial works like Jay Asher's Thirteen Reasons Why have provoked necessary conversations about suicide, bullying, and empathy. While debated for their portrayal, they inevitably force readers to confront the question: how do we treat each other, and how might small actions carry lasting consequences? Engaging with literature that speaks openly about struggle can normalize conversations around mental health and remind students that their feelings are valid. These narratives don't give simplistic solutions, but they do offer perspective, compassion, and the possibility of resilience. literature functions both as mirror and map-it reflects the confusion and pain of youthful experience while also pointing toward empathy, solidarity, and healing. Each of these works challenges stigma by centering the interior lives of characters often dismissed or misunderstood. They remind us that recovery and struggle are not linear, and that empathy is essential to reshaping how mental health is understood. At its best, literature becomes a bridge-helping us imagine a world where mental illness is not a stigma but part of what makes us human.

From Symbolism to Human Form Buddhist art has transformed significantly over time, reflecting changes in philosophy and cultural influence. In early Buddhism, the Buddha was never shown in human form. Instead, his presence was symbolized by objects like footprints, the Bodhi tree, or a simple turban, emphasizing the spiritual rather than physical. Around the 1st century CE, a major shift occurred with the emergence of the Buddha's anthropomorphic images, influenced by a unique blend of Indian and Hellenistic (Greek) artistic styles. These early depictions presented the Buddha with features inspired by Greek sculptures, such as wavy hair

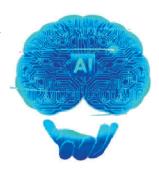
and robes resembling the toga, marking the start of Buddha statues that look like a serene, meditating figure. As Mahayana Buddhism spread, the philosophy expanded, introducing many Buddhas across time and space. Buddha images multiplied in form and size, often showing him seated, standing, or walking with different gestures symbolizing teachings and qualities. The concept of the Five Dhyani Buddhas arose, each representing distinct aspects of enlightenment with unique symbols. Later, Vajrayana Buddhism introduced radical art forms with fierce, wrathful Buddhas and powerful tantric images symbolizing both creation and destruction, reflecting the belief that enlightenment encompasses all aspects of life. Different regions adapted Buddhist art to their cultures-India and Southeast Asia focused on Gautama Buddha's human form, while China and Tibet produced diverse Buddhas from various schools, including joyful and compassionate bodhisattvas like the laughing Buddha and Maitreya. समाज एवं परिवारों में बुजुर्गो का महत्व

चेहरे पर अनुभव की सिलवटें जब झुरियों के रूप में उभर आती हैं, तब जिंदगी बदल जाती है। एक लंबा अनुभव साथ होता है लेकिन उन अनुभव को बांटने के लिए उनके लिए अपनों के पास वक्त नहीं होता। ऐसे में बुजुर्ग खुद को महत्वहीन समझने लगते हैं, जबिक सच यही है कि उनका महत्व समाज व परिवार दोनों ही के लिए बहुत ज्यादा है।

परंपरागत रूप से भारत में बुजुर्ग लोगों को हमेशा युवा पीढ़ी द्वारा उनके पैर छूकर सम्मानित किया गया है। बुजुर्ग लोग हमेशा हमारे परिवारों का खजाना रहे हैं। हालांकि इक्कीसवीं सदी के आधुनिक समाज में न केवल बुजुर्गों की संख्या में वृद्धि हुई है बल्कि भारत में बुजुर्गों के साथ दुर्व्यवहार, उत्पीड़न और परित्यक्त होने के मामले भी बढ़ गए हैं, अब ज़्यादातर बच्चे अपने माता - पिता को अकेला छोड़ रहे हैं या उन्हें वृद्धाश्रम भेज रहे हैं। वृद्धों का आश्रम अर्थात जहां पर एक साथ कई वृद्ध स्त्री और पुरूष एक घर में एक साथ रहते हों। यह भारत जैसे देश की विडंबना है कि जिस धरती पर माता-पिता को भगवान का स्वरूप मानते हैं. उसी धरती पर उनकी यह दयनीय स्थिति है। यह हमारे समाज व संस्कृति के बिल्कुल विपरीत है। कुछ संभ्रांत परिवार के लोग अपने माता - पिता को खुद ही वृद्ध आश्रम छोड़ कर आते हैं, जबकि कई माता-पिता ऐसे हैं जिनकी हालत इतनी बुरी होती है कि उनको घर से निकाल कर सड़कों पर दर - दर भटकने के लिए छोड दिया जाता है।

जैसे - जैसे भारत तेजी से शहरीकरण की ओर बढ़ रहा है, परिवार छोटी इकाइयों में बंट रहे हैं, आमतौर पर शहरी एवं अर्ध - शहरी क्षेत्रों में वृद्धाश्रमों की संख्या में भी वृद्धि हो रही है। इसके साथ ही, वृद्ध लोगों की देखभाल का प्रबंधन अब पेशेवरों या स्वैच्छिक संगठनों द्वारा संभाला जाने लगा है, जहाँ उन्हें सरकार और स्थानीय परोपकारी व्यक्तियों का समर्थन प्राप्त होता है।

समाज का एक दूसरा पहलू यह भी है कि जो बच्चे विदेशों में कामकाज करते हैं, वह अपने साथ माता – पिता को नहीं रख पाते हैं। वे उन्हें वृद्धाश्रम में रखते हैं तािक उनकी देखभाल अच्छे से हो सके। इसके लिए वे हर महीने उनके लिए खर्च रािश भी भेजते हैं। वृद्धाश्रम का प्रबंध होने से वृद्धों के लिए सहारा हो गया है। कम से कम उनकी रोज सुबह – शाम देखने वाला तो कोई है जो उनकी खोज – खबर ले सके। वहां साथ में बैठकर बात करने वाले हम उम्र हैं। वे अपने मन की बात किसी से कह सकते हैं जिससे मन की घुटन कुछ तो कम होता है। वहाँ उनकी चिकित्सा तथा खान – पान का ध्यान रखा जाता है। घर के बुजुर्ग हम सभी के लिए आशीर्वाद का एक रूप हैं, वे परिवार, समाज और राष्ट्र का सबसे बड़ा खजाना हैं। उनके पास अनुभव और

ज्ञान का एक विशाल महासागर है जो युवा पीढ़ी के लिए एक मार्गदर्शक के रूप में कार्य करता है। हमें अपने रीति - रिवाज व संस्कार उन्हीं से मिलते हैं। जब जिंदगी कठिन मोड से गुजरती है तो उन्हीं की सलाह व प्रेरणा काम आती हैं। समाज को सही राह पर चलने की शिक्षा उन्हीं से मिलती है। आज की पीढी व समाज मे भी फिज़्लखर्ची और जिंदगी को लापरवाह अंदाज में जीने की तरीके बढ़ रहे हैं, ऐसे में वो ही हमें सही राह दिखाते हैं जैसे जिंदगी को अनुशासन से जीना कितना जरूरी है, समय की पाबंदी, पानी व बिजली बचत, कम सुविधाओं में भी कैसे गुजारा किया जा सकता है आदि। वो अच्छी तरह से जानते व समझा सकते हैं। विनम्रता का महत्व व सकारात्मकता से जीने का अंदाज उन्हीं से हम सीख सकते हैं। उन्होंने किस तरह से अभावों के बीच भी जीना व संघर्ष करना सीखा, जबकि हमें वो सारी सविधाएं प्रदान करते हैं. ऐसे में हमें जिंदगी से शिकायतें क्यों हैं? हम अपने घर के बड़े - बुजुर्गों को देखकर उनसे सबक ले सकते हैं।

लेकिन आजकल लोग बूढ़े लोगों को बोझ समझने लगे है। उनका मानना है कि बड़ों में अब नई चीजें सीखने की क्षमता नहीं है जो सच्चाई से बहुत दूर है। शोध के अनुसार मानव मस्तिष्क कभी भी बढ़ना बंद नहीं करता है। बुजुर्गों का हर समस्या के प्रति एक विशिष्ट दृष्टिकोण होता है, जो हम केवल समय आने पर ही समझ सकते है।

हमारे वेद पुराणों तथा पौराणिक कथाओं में माता-पिता को सर्वश्रेष्ठ बताया गया है। देवताओं में भी जब श्रेष्ठता की पहचान के लिए एक प्रतियोगिता का आयोजन होता है तथा निर्णय यह निकलकर आता है कि जो देवता सबसे पहले पृथ्वी का चक्कर लगाकर आएगा वही श्रेष्ठ होगा और उसी की सबसे पहले पूजा होगी। सभी अपने-अपने वाहन पर सवार होकर निकल पडे जबिक गणपति जी ने अपने माता व पिता शिव पार्वती की परिक्रमा की वे बताते हैं कि माता पिता मेरे लिए इस लोक से बढ़कर हैं। मैं जो कुछ हूँ, उन्हीं की वजह से ही हूँ। इसलिए आज हमें जरूरत है फिर से इंडियन की बजाय भारतीय बनने की। हमे अपने मुल्यों को फिर से समझने तथा जागरूकता फैलाने की आवश्यकता हैं जिससे बुजुर्ग माता - पिता अपना मन मसोसकर वृद्धाश्रम में जाने की बजाय ख़शी से अपने बेटे - बेटियों के साथ रहें। बेहतर होगा कि उनकी कांपती जिंदगी का दर्द हम समझें और उन्हें अपना वक्त देकर उनका कीमती आशीर्वाद लें, ताकि जिंदगी आसान व खुशियों से भरी हुई हो।
